

### Center for American Indian Resilience Conference Student Poster Application

Tucson, Arizona August 7-8, 2013

#### **Purpose:**

The **Center for American Indian Resilience (CAIR)** is proud to offer an opportunity for students to display a poster at the Center for American Indian Resilience Conference in Tucson, Arizona on August 7-8, 2013.

The CAIR Conference addresses resilience in indigenous communities. Conference topics will include exploration of resiliency in academia, from cultural wisdom, and from community practice.

#### **Eligibility:**

All undergraduate, graduate and recent graduate (within 1 year of graduation) students interested in submitting a poster are encouraged to participate

#### **Poster Session Guidelines:**

A Poster session is a graphic presentation of authors' research. All research in health and wellness related topics that are done with indigenous communities are acceptable. The authors illustrate their findings by displaying graphs, photos, diagrams and a small amount of text on the poster boards.

There will be two poster sessions on Wednesday August 7<sup>th</sup> (1:00-1:30pm) and Thursday August 8<sup>th</sup> (1:00-1:30pm). The author must remain by his/her poster for the duration of the poster sessions. If handouts are distributed, bring approximately 30 copies. Highlight the authors' names and address information in case the viewer is interested in contacting them for more information. It's also a good idea to bring business cards with you.

#### **Poster Board Information:**

The CAIR conference staff will provide a foam board for each poster. The author should prepare all materials in advance.

- \* The poster board will be a sturdy foam board that is 30 in tall by 40 in wide, placed on an easel
- \* Clips will be available onsite for mounting the posters to the foam board.
- \* Posters may be set up in the morning of each conference date. Posters should be taken down within 30 minutes after each session ends.
- \* Materials should include the title of the presentation and the list of authors. Letters in the title should be at least 1 inch high. Bring all illustrations needed -- figures, tables, color photographs, charts. It may be helpful to consult an artist about the display.
- \* The material should be well labeled and legible from a distance of 2 yards. Lettering should be

bold. If you will be posting typed material, use a large font size (20 to 24 point font) on white, pale yellow or cream-colored non-glossy paper. Use 1-inch margins. Avoid use of fancy fonts. Use upper and lowercase letters. Simple serif fonts such as "Times New Roman" are easier to read than sans (without) serif fonts such as "Geneva".
